# Annual Report Presented by the Principal, Mr Chen Siew Yui

at the 81st Speech and Prize-Giving Day  
(October 1986 — September 1987)

Our Guest-of-Honour, Dr Phua Kok Khoo, Supervisor of our school, members of the school management committee, staff, pupils, ladies and gentlemen.

On behalf of the staff and pupils of Tuan Mong High School, I welcome you to our 81st Annual Celebration Speech and Prize Presentation Day. We are especially honoured to have with us this morning, our school supervisor, Dr Phua Kok Khoo, who despite his heavy commitment, has consented to be our Guest-of-Honour and to give away prizes to our prize winners. Dr Phua is an Associate Professor of Physics at the National University of Singapore. As our school's supervisor, he is always concerned with the welfare of the pupils of the school. Thank you very much for your presence here today Dr Phua.

It is now my privilege to present to you the annual report for the year 1987.

## School Enrolment and Staff

This year we have only 28 classes

2 Secondary One  
5 Secondary Two  
12 Secondary Three  
6 Secondary Four  
3 Secondary Five

Of these 28 classes, 13 are Normal Classes and 15 are Express Classes. There are 21 classes in the AM Session and 7 classes in the PM Session. The total enrolment of pupils is 894. Of these 538 are boys and 356 are girls.

Currently the staff strength stands at 40, of whom 35 are graduates and 5 are non-graduates.

Owing to the reduction in the number of classes, 8 teachers have to be transferred to other schools.

We wish all of them our best in their new schools.

We would like to welcome Miss Lai Chin Kwei who joined the school on 3rd April, 1987.

## Academic Performance

- (a) In the 1986 GCE 'O' level examination, 101 Sec 4 pupils sat for the examination and 75 pupils (74.26%) obtained credit passes in 3 or more subjects. Compared with the 1985 result of 75.40%, there is a slight decrease of 1.14%.
- (b) In the English Stream 1986 GCE 'N' level examination, we presented 121 candidates, and 63 (52.06%) were eligible for promotion to Secondary 5N. Compared with the 1985 result of 38.50%, there is an improvement of 13.56%. 34 pupils (28.09%) were eligible to repeat Sec 4N, 24 (19.83%) were eligible to join VITB.

In the Chinese Stream, out of 52 candidates presented, 36 (69.23%) were eligible for promotion to Secondary 5N, and 8 (15.38%) were eligible to repeat and 8 (15.38%) were eligible to study at the VITB.

## Staff Development

There was greater awareness among members of the staff to further develop their resources. Learning is a continual process, and our staff members have been very busy attending in-service courses, seminars, talks, workshops etc. A workshop on comprehension skills was conducted by Mr Andrew Watts, Specialist Inspector of English on 26/3/87. Mr Watts also conducted another workshop on 19/2/87 on the teaching of comprehension.

A sharing-cum-workshop session was held on 23/7/87 during which teachers showed their ideas on the teaching of summary writing. 10 teachers attended a PASSES seminar which was conducted on 17/1/87 at the RELC. 25 teachers attended a workshop on the "learning skills in content areas" on 1st August, 1987. The workshop was jointly organised by Tuan Mong High School, Nan Chiau High School, Kim Seng Technical School, Gan Eng Seng Secondary School and St. Teresa's High School.

## School Curriculum and Special Programme

All curriculum subjects are taught in the school and pupils are offered fixed subject combination in the Upper Secondary. The main weak subject in the school is English. To underline the importance of English and to improve the standard of English, the school gets special assistance from MOE in participating in the PASSES project. PASSES is the acronym for "Project to Assist Selected Schools in English Skills." The PASSES English Project is in its last year in the school.

Besides the Passes Project, we also conducted the following activities for our pupils.

### (a) Implementation of writing of diary

As our students are generally weak writers, the school has implemented the idea of diary/journal-writing. Each pupil is expected to record in his/her diary the happenings of each day. We hope that by implementing this activity, the English standard can be improved and hopefully the writing habit can be inculcated in our pupils.

### (b) The USSR Programme

We are also continuing our Uninterrupted Sustained Silent Reading Period and the Scrap book practice. Pupils have to read books for 20 minutes before they start their normal lessons.

### (c) Other Activities

The other activities conducted to promote greater use of English are:

- (i) Costume parade in conjunction with the library week. The items for this parade were based on Characters from story books.
- (ii) Drama competition –  
In order to improve the communicative and acting skills of our pupils, a drama competition was organised.
- (iii) Scrabble competition –  
To build up students' command of vocabulary.

#### (iv) AVA presentation

Film of general knowledge topics were shown during assembly at least once a month so as to help increase students' general knowledge and hopefully to improve the students' ability to visualize what they read in comprehension passages.

### Extra Curricular Activities

ECA in Tuan Mong is very well organised and properly run. The school by organising a number of activities, is able to satisfy the needs of the pupils. We have 7 Uniformed Groups, 7 types of Sports and Games and 14 Clubs and Societies to cater to the needs of our pupils who may opt for such extra-curricular activities. Many of these clubs can be considered as co-curricular activities. The main aim of these clubs and societies is to broaden the experience of their numbers.

The year 1987 has been a successful year for many of the ECAs.

- (a) In the Youth Festival Art & Crafts exhibition organised by MOE. Zhuang Yiping and Yang Haifeng of 3L were awarded certificates of Distinction.
- (b) In the Youth Festival Music and Dance presentation organised by the South Zone, our items "Longevity" and "Return from the market fair" received a certificate of merit.
- (c) In the 4th National Painting and Calligraphy Competition organised by the Outram Park C.C. Art Club, Zhuang Yiping of 3L was awarded 3rd prize and Fu Xiuhua of 4A was highly commended.
- (d) In the .22 Revolver Shooting Competition organised by HQ NPCC, our NPCC boys came in 5th.
- (e) 3 students Tung Poh Wah, Tan Lye Meng and Raymond Low of our NCC Unit were selected to attend the 10th NCC modified airborne course organised by the school of command, SAF. The training was from 11/6 – 27/6/87. It is an honour for the school to have so many cadets being trained for parachuting.
- (f) Our student Ye Jinguan of Sec 1A won the 1st prize in 100m Free Style, 2nd prize in 50m Breast Stroke, 3rd prize in 100m Breast Sroke in the Swimming Competition organised by SASA.

### Development of the School

With the recommendation of the Ministry of Education, the school has renovated 5 classrooms into Home Economics Rooms at the cost of \$163,993.95. We are very grateful to MOE for its subsidies of \$92,860.00. We are in the process of purchasing the apparatus and equipment for the rooms. It is hoped that by upgrading our facilities, our girls can study Home Economics in our own school.

### Conclusion

I have now come to the end of my report. But before I end, I would like to congratulate certain groups of people. First, I would like to congratulate the prize winners who will be receiving book prizes and certificates of merit for their scholastic or ECA achievements. We are very proud of them and extend to them and their proud parents our sincere congratulations. Secondly, I would like to thank my Vice-Principal, my Senior Assistants, my Sports Secretary, my Discipline Masters, my Senior Subject teachers and the teachers i/c of various ECA groups and all the teachers and non-teaching staff for their unfailing support.

Finally, my thanks to all of you for just being here to celebrate this happy day with us. Thank you very much.

# 端蒙中学常年报告

(1986年10月—1987年9月)

我们的贵宾，本校监学潘国驹博士，各位董事，各位教职员和同学们，诸位先生女士。

我谨代表端蒙中学的师生，热烈欢迎各位光临参加本校第八十一周年校庆暨常年颁奖礼。我们非常荣幸承蒙监学潘国驹博士在百忙中拨冗出席今天的盛会，作为我们的贵宾并主持颁奖礼。潘博士是国大的物理教授，作为本校的监学，他时时关怀学生的福利。潘博士，多谢你的光临。

现在让我向各位汇报本校1987年的校务概况：

## 学生人数和教职员情况

今年本校只有28班，计中一2班、中二5班、中三12班、中四6班和中五3班。其中13班是普通班，15班是快捷班。上午班有21班，下午班有7班。学生人数共计894名，男生538名，女生356名。

目前的教员有40位，其中35位是大学毕业资格，5位是非大学毕业资格。

由于班级减少，有8位教员须转到他校：

- (a) 李慧芬师于 2/1/87 调往圣尼各拉女中。
- (b) 蓝钦娥师于 2/1/87 调往南侨中学。
- (c) 陈蔼仪师于 2/1/87 调往尚志中学。
- (d) 陈绍芝师于 2/1/87 调往培才中学。
- (e) 吴承惠师于 2/1/87 调往红山中学。
- (f) 王思精师于 2/1/87 调往博文中学。
- (g) 陈福源师于 2/1/87 调往颜永成中学。
- (h) 苏金珠师于 14/1/87 调往美景中学。

我们希望他们在新的学校一切顺利。

我们欢迎赖金贵师于 3/4/87 到任。

## 学术表现

(a) 在1986年普通教育证书(普通水准)会考，本校的101考生中，有75位或74.26%考获三科及格，比1985年的75.40%，稍微退步1.14%。

(b) 在普通课程的会考中，本校英文源流的121位考生中，有63位(52.06%)能升入中五。比1985年的38.50%，进步了13.56%。有35位学生(28.09%)可以重修中四，24位学生(19.83%)可进入职专。

华文源流方面，52位考生中有36位(69.23%)能升上中五，8位(15.38%)可进入职专。

## 教职员的进修

学习是一个连续的过程，我们的教员都非常忙碌的参加许多在职训练课程和研讨会等。在26/3/87，由英文专科视学 Mr. Andrew Watts 主持一项理解技能的研讨会。他也在19/2/87进行另一项理解教学的研讨会。

在23/7/87的一次研讨会中，教师们发表他们对于长文缩短教学的概念。有10位老师参加17/1/87在区域语言中心举行的PASSES研讨会。在1/8/87有25位老师出席一个有

关学习技巧的研讨会，这个研讨会是由本校、南侨、金声、颜永成和德兰中学联合举办的。  
学校课程和特别计划

所有的课程科目都在学校教授，还为高年级的学生提供固定的科目组合。本校较弱的科目是英文。为了强调英文的重要性的提高英文程度，本校得到教育部的特别帮助以参加 PASSES 计划。PASSES 是“强调被选学校英文技巧的计划”的缩写词。这项计划在本校已进入最后一年。此外，我们还为学生推行下列的活动：

(a) 实行写日记

由于我们学生的书写能力较差，学校因而实行写日记的办法，让学生在他们的日记簿中写下每天所发生的事，希望推行这次活动，可以提高英文程度并灌输给学生写作的习惯。

(b) USSR 计划

我们继续实行持续不断的默读节和剪贴簿。每天在正课前学生必须阅读 20 分钟的故事书。

(c) 其他活动

实行其他活动以促进英文的更广泛应用：

(i) 图书馆周的化妆比赛，这项比赛的项目是以故事书的人物为主。

(ii) 戏剧比赛—为了提高沟通和表演技巧，因而举办戏剧比赛。

(iii) 拼字比赛—加强学生掌握词汇的能力。

(iv) 视听节目—每个月至少一次在周会放映普通常识题材的影片，以增广学生的见闻，并希望间接提高他们对理解篇章的领悟能力。

课外活动

本校的课外活动都有良好的组织和适当的推行。学校有许多项课外活动以满足学生的需求。我们有 7 种制服队伍，7 种体育运动项目以及 14 种学会团体。许多学会可视为配合课程的活动，这些学会团体的主要宗旨是增加学员的经验。

1987 年是许多课外活动的成功年。

(a) 在教育部主办的青年节美术图工展览会中，本校 3L 的庄益平和杨海峰取得优异奖。

(b) 在南区主办的青年节音乐和舞蹈表演，我们的节目“长寿”和“市集归来”得到优胜奖。

(c) 在欧南园联络所美术学会主办的第四届全国美术书法比赛中，3L 的庄益平得到第三名；4A 的傅秀华也得到佳评。

(d) 在学生警察团总部举办的射击比赛中，本校学生警察团男生队伍得到第五名。

(e) 本校陆军少年团 3 位团员唐宝华、陈利明和刘里门参加了第十届跳伞课程。训练日期由 6 月 11 日至 6 月 27 日。有这样多位团员参加跳伞训练，这是本校的光荣。

(f) 在 SASA 主办的游泳比赛中，1A 的叶锦冠荣获一百公尺自由式冠军，五十公尺俯游亚军，以及一百公尺俯游季军。

学校的发展

在教育部的建议下，本校耗资 163,993.95 元将 5 间教室改建成家政室。我们非常感激教育部津贴 92,860 元，目前我们正为家政室购置器材和配备。今后女生就可以在本校上家政课。

结语





ANALYSIS OF SUBJECT RESULTS (SEC 4 EXP)





**Evelyn (3A):** A Famosa was a historical experience. It felt 'haunted'.





# **Speech by the Principal, Mr Chen Siew Yui on the “Parents-Meet-The-Teachers Session” on 11th April '87**

On behalf of the school, I welcome all of you to this “Parents-Meet-The-Teachers” Session. This is one of the major functions organised by the school.

It is an honour for us to have your presence here. Your acceptance of our invitation proves that you care for the welfare and future of your son or daughter. It is important that all parents should show concern and interest in the education of their children.

In a normal school day, your child spends only six hours in the school. The school requires your assistance and co-operation in supervising and encouraging your child to study outside the school hours. Without using effectively their ex-curricular time at home, it is impossible to achieve good academic results.

For your information, TMHS is already 80 years old. This year, we have 28 classes, 26 in the English Stream, 2 in the Chinese Stream. The pupil enrolment is 877. The teaching staff is made up of 38 teachers.

The school offers the students in the Art and Science courses of study and I am very happy to report that the performance of our pupils has been encouraging and is improving.

In addition to the basic requirements the school has an air-conditioned library, an air-conditioned language laboratory, a conference room, a medium resource room and a Geography and History room. The physical environment is conducive to learning.

All our teachers are dedicated and committed to their work. They have been trying their best to help the pupils under their charge.

As you might be aware, under the New Education System, pupils are streamed to the Normal, Express or Special course based on their PSLE results:

Pupils in the Express Course will sit for the GCE ‘O’ Level Examination at the end of 4 years. Pupils in the Normal Course sit for the GCE ‘N’ Level Examination in the 4th year. For some of these pupils, the GCE ‘N’ Level Examination will be terminal. Those who perform well in the GCE ‘N’ Level Examination however, will proceed to do a 5th year and sit for the GCE ‘O’ Level Examination.

There will be provision for pupils to move laterally from one course to another according to the capabilities and performance. Pupils in the N-Course can move to the E-Course if they perform well. On the other hand, under-achievers in the E-Course may be transferred to the N-Course.

Our school curriculum is based on the guidelines provided by the Ministry of Education. The subject combination, syllabus, textbooks, teaching strategies used have been approved by MOE.

Participation in Extra-Curricular Activities is compulsory for every pupil. Every pupil has to participate in 2 ECAs, either Group A+B or Group A+C

Group A covers Sports and games  
Group B covers Uniformed units  
Group C covers Clubs and Societies

You can check your child's student card to find out the type of ECA he participates in and the time and day he is required to be in school.

In order to improve the English results, the school has adopted the following strategies:

**1) Keeping of a scrapbook**

Every pupil has to keep a scrapbook for newspaper or magazine articles. He has to read one article every day. The article has to be dated. He has to underline the difficult words and look up their meanings in the dictionary. He has to write at least one, two, three or four sentences, about the article read depending on the level he is in. Teachers check the scrapbooks regularly.

**2) Allocation time for regular reading in the time-table**

We called it USSR or Uninterrupted Sustained Silent Reading. To cultivate the reading habit by which pupils can develop a wider vocabulary and improve their English, all pupils begin their school day by silent reading for 20 minutes in the classrooms.

**3) Writing of diaries**

Every pupil is required to write a diary everyday. By implementing this programme, we hope to inculcate the writing habit for our pupils and hopefully can upgrade the English standard in our school.

**4) Prohibition to speak dialects**

To create an English speaking environment, pupils are encouraged to communicate in English. No students are allowed to speak dialects within the school premises.

Evaluation of pupils' academic performance is carried out through continued assessment and semestral examination. The assessments are conducted in January, February, March, April, July, August and September. The results are recorded in the assessment card which has to be signed by you.

The Mid-year Examination this year will begin on 11th May and the Final Examination on 19th October. For the Sec IV students, the 2nd Language Examination is scheduled to be on 1st June and the preliminary Examination will commence on 5th September 1987.

The criteria for passing the Examination and promotion to the next level will be as follows.

For Sec One and Two Express Course, 50% of the aggregate marks to be scored in all examination subjects and a pass in the English Language.

For the Normal Course, a pass in EL and 2 other subjects.

For Sec 3 and 4, passes in 3 subjects, including the 1st language.

Please pay attention to the test and examination results of you son or daughter and to encourage him/her to achieve excellence in their results. Advise your son and daughter to spend his/her precious time meaningfully and effectively. It is advisable to ask your child to have a time table drawn up so that a certain number of hours a day is set aside for revision and for completion of homework. You could also discourage your child to fall into the habit of sitting in front of the TV set every night when there is homework or revision to be completed. You should also advise them to avoid wasting their precious time in the shopping centres or hawkers centres. Wasting too much time on other activities would adversely affect his examination results.

What is worrying us to-day, is that too many pupils give up too easily, in the face of difficulties. They do not do their work regularly and also set very low standards for themselves. When teachers set 10 problems to solve Mathematics, they are quite satisfied when they complete about 7. In fact, some pupils resort to copying from their friends so that they can pass up the required pieces of work. Such pupils are cheating themselves and are not likely to do well eventually.

Unless it is absolutely necessary you should discourage your child from taking on part-time jobs during term time or holidays. Your child needs time in this studies, if he is to attain good results.


Traditionally our school has emphasized the acquiring of knowledge to pass examinations. Through better use of teaching aids, better design of the syllabus, we try to make schooling a more enjoyable and challenging experience for your child.

In place of passive learning, we encourage our pupils to read widely and discover things for themselves. We also provide ample opportunities for co-curricular activities to mould their character, self-confidence and team spirit.

We also try to provide adequate training and facilities to develop pupils to be rugged, healthy and fit and to encourage mass participation in sports and games.

The Principal, Vice-Principal and teachers will be prepared to help your child to deal with any problem he faces. We welcome you to visit the school at any time to discuss any problem faced by your child. Please do not hesitate to consult us. I promise we will try our very best to help you.

## **Speech**

### **by the Principal, Mr Chen Siew Yui**

### **on 21st April 1987**

Dr. Phua Kok Khoo, Supervisor of the School Management Committee, parents, ladies and gentlemen, boys and girls.

On behalf of the staff and pupils of Tuan Mong High School, I welcome all of you to our Annual Sports Day meet and prize presentation. This is indeed an auspicious occasion, for we have here with us, our Guest of Honour, Dr. Phua Kok Khoo, who has kindly consented to give away the prizes to the winners. Dr. Phua, the supervisor of our School Management Committee is a famous scientist and Associate Professor of Physics in the National University of Singapore. Despite his very busy schedule, he has found time to show interest in the welfare of our students. May I represent the school to say "Thank You" Dr. Phua.

Annual Sports Day has been a regular and prominent feature of our school ECA programme. It provides a yearly opportunity for pupils to gather together to engage in meaningful athletic competition. Besides providing the students with academic education, our school has always emphasized the importance of physical fitness for our boys and girls. The rationale for this needs no explanation. I am sure that parents would like to see their children grow up strong and healthy. If our pupils become merely bookworms and do not go beyond the confines of their textbook, then a valuable part of their education will be missing. It is the purpose of the ECA programme, sports and games to complement the academic education of our children and introduce them to aspects of physical education so that they become physically fit.

Due to our sedentary life style as flat-dwellers, many Singaporeans seldom exercise. Due to the lack of physical exercise, many students become obese or overweight. The school Health Service has found that there are seven times more children who are overweight today than there were 10 years ago. Besides that the records of the Registry of Birth and Deaths show that death due to heart failure and heart disease is on the increase. Between 1974 and 1984, the number of such deaths per 100,000 of population rose by 38 per cent.

I would like to urge pupils to budget your day properly so that there is enough time for school work as well as for sports and games. In this way, the school life will be enriched and you will leave school with a full education.

We have tried our very best to encourage participation in sports. We have conducted the St. John's Island camp. We are planning to have our swimming carnival and the other types of sports and games. I hope all of you will make good use of these opportunities.

To the winner, I congratulate you on your achievement. But don't be proud, you must keep on training in order to maintain your standard. To the loser, I urge you to continue trying, maybe you can get a prize next year.

Finally, I would like to express my very sincere thanks to all the teachers, especially the sports secretary, Mr Lim Poon Heok and Assistant Sports Secretary, Mr Ng Singh Kuan, Mr Sia Kian Teck who have spent much of their time and energy in organising the events. I also like to thank the competitors for their participation and all those who in one way or another have contributed to the success of this meet.

It is a privilege, as well as a real pleasure, for me to call upon our guest of Honour, Dr. Phua Kok Khoo to give away the prizes. Dr. Phua, Please!.




TMHS students celebrated Teacher's Day in a unique way this year. The Prefectorial Board planned & organised the programme independently.



他们前后共花了一两个月的时间准备，而花在制作的时间约一两个星期。



Our cadets have been fully occupied by the varied activities throughout the year. We plan to improve our activities further to make it more enjoyable as well as educational.









Other events in which we participated included the Annual School Sports Meet, National Day Concert and the Annual Ngee Ann Kongsi staff dinner.


Our last performance was on the 1st of October during our school speech day.

We look forward to a more fulfilling and challenging 1988 and we are grateful to our instructor and teachers for their support, advice and guidance.



- (2) PM Session – Miss Ho Y. H.







由今年下半年开始，书法学会有自己的活动课室，不再利用美术室活动。






希望明年度有更多中一的新同学加入本学会。使舞蹈学会能生存下去。








## 美术学会



She immediately called the fire brigade. They arrived moments later to put out the fire and rescued me. My dad was very furious when he learnt it and gave me a thrashing.

All these events of my childhood days are unforgettable to me. That is why till this very day, I am still able to recall them.



Pada malam yang sunyi ini, aku cuba melupakan Zaidi tetapi wajahnya selalu bermain di ruang mataku.



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
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
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
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
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
